From the Desk of Pastor Laura

2024 Saturday/Sunday Lenten Series, Holy Week, and Easter

The Worship Arts Team has taken on the planning of this year's Saturday and Sunday Lenten Theme: The Covenants of God. In their study of the Scripture lessons we will read in Lent, the team discovered a beautiful connection between the covenants that God makes with God's people throughout the Old Testament and the covenant that God makes with us in baptism, made known in the person of Jesus Christ.

The covenantal theme of baptism will also weave throughout the Saturday/Sunday worship services in Lent, beginning with the start of the season on Ash Wednesday (February 14). During this service, we will receive the ashen cross on our foreheads, which harkens back to the cross that was traced with water for us at our baptisms. Throughout the Lenten season, we will view and understand our own baptisms through the lens of God's covenants with God's people, all rooted in God's love and grace.

Week 1: New Life in Christ (Genesis 9: 8-17 & Mark 1: 9-15)

In the story of the Flood, God makes a covenant with Noah's family and the future generations of God's people with the symbol of the rainbow. In doing so, God promises to refrain from widespread destruction in the future. The covenant that God makes with us in baptism is done so individually, but the new life that we receive through the grace of Jesus Christ is not only for us, but also for the generations that will come after us.

Week 2: Follow Christ (Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16 & Mark 8:31-38)

In the story of Abraham and Sarah, God makes an everlasting covenant with them that they will be the ancestors of many. As a sign of this covenant, Sarah and Abraham receive new names from God. In our baptisms, we, too, receive new identities as we clothe ourselves in the love of God. As we live out our baptismal identity, we are called to follow Christ and mirror God's love to the world.

Week 3: Gift of Law and Love (Exodus 20:1-17 & John 2:13-22)

In the account of the Ten Commandments being given to Moses and the Israelites, God follows the gift of freedom from slavery with the gift of the law to guide the Israelites in that freedom. In the Gospel lesson for this weekend, Jesus throws merchants out of the temple, harkening back to the law of God that states the holiness of the temple as the house of God. The gift of Law is met with the gift of Love in Jesus, and made real to us in our baptisms: we are washed in grace, rooted in God's liberating love, and as sinners freed from our sins, we strive to live out justice and mercy in the world.

Week 4: Believe in the Light (Numbers 21:4-9 & John 3:14-21)

The passage from the book of Numbers tells the story of the promise God makes with Moses of how God's people can find life. In the same way, Jesus teaches that those to look to him in faith will also live. When we receive the sign of the cross in baptism, we are given a reminder that through our faith, we can find life and hope in God.

Week 5: Jesus Christ (Jeremiah 31:31-34 & John 12:20-33)

In the story from Jeremiah, God promises that a new covenant will be made with God's people in the future that they will know God by heart. We see this new covenant fulfilled in the person of Jesus Christ, his death on the cross, and the defeat of death through his resurrection. God's covenant with us in baptism shows us God's heart and draws God's love on our hearts.

Week 6: Palm Sunday Weekend (Isaiah 50:4-9a & Mark 11: 1-11)

This weekend, we sing hosannas as Jesus rides into Jerusalem, surrounded by shouts of glory, while the cross waits on the horizon. As we prepare to journey with Jesus through his suffering and death, we lament the necessity of his suffering for the sake of our lives and salvation. In Jesus' death, God makes a new covenant with God's people that comes straight from God's heart.

The season of Lent is upon us and is similar to other seasons within the church calendar year because it is a holy and sacred time in our faith lives. Lent is a journey that begins on Ash Wednesday, where we receive the imposition of ashes upon our forehead as a reminder of our frailties and ends on Palm Sunday, the day that Jesus begins his triumphal final steps towards the cross. During Lent our spirituality invites us to look deeply at our patterns and behaviors and consider how fragile and finite our lives truly are.

During this sacred season of looking inward, we ask God to grant us those things that will help sustain and guide us in our faith journey. This Lenten season we invite you to join us each Wednesday evening at 6:30 p.m. for our Holden Evening Prayer service as we journey through the theme of *God Grant Me*. Throughout Lent we will hear from members of our congregation as they share their faith stories with us. You are invited to come and take this holy and sacred journey together in faith.





Finance Corner and Council Members

2023 is in the books and 2024 is underway! Looking back on 2023, the plan was to end the year with a deficit of \$27,742 for the Sustaining Fund and the deficit ended up being \$1,060. While that looks good, a few things should be highlighted. First, total contributions for 2023 were \$38,225 less than expected. Second, the smaller deficit was offset by reduced expenses of \$36,175 due to having a decrease staff. Third, fundraisers (Fall Social and Garage Sale) generated \$12,834 more than budgeted. While 2023 had some bumps in the road, fewer reserves were needed to cover the deficit that did occur, which is certainly a positive! Another positive for 2023 is that the Special Appeal to reduce member construction loans yielded funds needed to pay member loans due in 2023 for \$21,750.

Looking forward to 2024, the Finance Team has been working with the Staff and Council to prepare a budget that will provide for ongoing operations but will also include adding a half-time SPARK Director to Staff targeted to start in July. The 2024 budget will also address the upcoming building loan rate increase expected in November 2024 and put Crown of Glory in position to absorb the impact of that increase in 2025. This budget was presented at the Annual Meeting on Sunday, February 11.

It was a dark and stormy night... (I've always wanted to do that) on a Saturday and my wife, Jane, and I discussed giving Crown of Glory, in the neighboring city of Chaska, a look to see if it felt right for us. We had previously visited a larger church, the kind with the comfy stadium seating and

right for us. We had previously visited a larger church, the kind with the comfy stadium seating and professional staff to do most of the ministry work. A place where you can sit back, relax, and be entertained as you worship, and even more tempting, they served a reasonably priced breakfast on site between services. I guess is just didn't feel right because we were thinking about going to Crown of Glory next.

That was in the summer of 2012, before the Big Remodel and Expansion at Crown of Glory. To be kind, I'll say the building looked a bit worn, well-used, and cramped for space in most areas. On the positive side, there were two pastors leading the service: one (Pastor Matt) laying down some youthful jazzy licks on his acoustic guitar and the other (Pastor Reggie) preaching in a confident and skilled manner you would expect from a pastor older than this fellow appeared. It was hard to tell who the senior pastor was. By the second or third Sunday, we not only knew who was what, and what was where, but that we had found a church family and home.

In the nearly twelve years since we joined, Crown of Glory has worked - and I do mean worked - its way through several significant changes and challenges. We raised funding for the major updating and expansion of our church campus. We found a way to make our dream more affordable by teaming up with Mission Builders for the initial construction. When concurrent construction of the Vikings stadium caused our construction material costs to skyrocket, we relied more heavily on our members and staff to help complete the work.

"It's a drywall installer on scaffolding, it's a painter on a ladder, no it's Super Pastor Reggie!" And when we exhausted the money we could borrow from financial institutions, we found a way forward with private construction loans from individuals. We had substantially completed the remodel and expansion, and then the Pandemic came and changed our world, and the way not just Crown of Glory, but all brick-and-mortar churches, go about their calls to worship and ministry.

And now, here we are, looking for ways to deal with changes in contribution levels and discerning how we can redefine staffing levels and work descriptions to match the needs of our ministries with the available resources.

As I look back over all the challenges we have overcome these past twelve years, it is obvious to me that the Good Lord loves us and has, and will continue, to bless us in our ministry journey together.


