After review of the financial statements of Crown of Glory as of December 31, 2023 it was their opinion that the statements fairly presented the financial position and the results of operations for the past twelve months.

#### 2023 Summary

- Recapped last year's 3 year budget proposal to build back to balance. Approved a budget to be \$23K in the red,
- 2023 ended about \$1K in the red. Ahead \$27K of budget. BUT, we were \$38K behind in contributions, reduced staff expenses, fundraisers.

# 2024 Pastor Laura Laughlin's Report Pastor of Worship and Music

Siblings in Christ,

Another year has come and gone, already! Time certainly flew by this past year and the writing of this report has served as a gift to me as I have reflected on all the ministry, music, and worship that took place at Crown of Glory in 2024. I invite you to read through each category and join me in giving thanks to God for all the ways the Spirit has moved through the people and worship within our community of faith.

#### **Worship and Arts**

The Worship Arts Team did incredible work this past year at selecting themes for each liturgical season and bringing those themes to life. The vision, creativity, and dedication of each of these team members (and friends of the team) are the reasons for the incredible artwork that we have enjoyed in worship this past year. In the season of Lent, three arches were built and added to the Sanctuary as a way to display the colors that change throughout the season. As the fall began, the team built and added to two large signs at the front of the Sanctuary to depict and describe two themes for that season: Kingdom of God and Who Am I? Throughout the year, our AV Team, Worship Assistants, and Hospitality Volunteers gave of their time, energy, and expertise to support the worship at Crown of Glory and lead the congregation. #### Altar Guild

# **2024 Ministry Team Report Justice & Inclusion Team**

Charter Statement: The Crown of Glory Justice & Inclusion Team is called by grace to foster community, work for equality, ally with our neighbors, and educate ourselves and others to challenge the forces that seek to exclude, harm. Or discriminate against any child of God.

In February 2024 the J & I Team hosted a visit to the Chaska Mosque and we learned a lot about our Muslim neighbors. John Emery and Faraz Currimbhoy were very welcoming and we were treated with Somali tea and treats.

In April we hosted a potluck and discussion of the book Getting to Ellen: A Memoir About Love, Honesty and Gender Change. The author, Ellie Krug, joined us and led 18 attendees in a discussion about love and inclusion of those who are different from us.

At the Ministry Fair in September our Team organized collection drives for Bountiful Basket and The Sock Drawer. We collected 88 pounds of non-food items (paper, hygiene and cleaning products), 202 pairs of socks and 28 pairs of underwear.

The Team also continued to work on being a more welcoming church by becoming a Reconciling in Christ Church. We revised our proposed RIC statement to read: "Crown of Glory loves and welcomes all people, including all sexual orientations, gender identities, gender expressions and historically oppressed individuals. We celebrate the sacredness of all. We prioritize listening to diverse voices and are committed to dismantling oppression, opposing racism, and fostering a safe space".

Two RIC panel discussions were held in November and In January we asked the congregation to complete a survey stating whether they support the above statement and support having COG become an RIC church. The results of this survey will be shared with the Church Council and we will be asking them to bring this question to a vote at the annual meeting in February.

In January over 55 people attended the Immigration Issues training at Crown of Glory. The Justice & Inclusion Team was proud to be a co-sponsor along with His House and Latino Voices. Welcoming refugees is an important part of our faith.

We are excited to welcome two new members to our Team this past year and we look forward to continuing our goals of working toward justice and inclusion for all COG members.

Crown of Glory is a local distribution site for this program. Once a month people have the opportunity to purchase food at a discounted price and we (the volunteers) help them with getting their purchases out to their cars. Here are a few particulars:

- Packs of frozen meat and fresh produce can be purchased at up to 40% off retail prices. Question: Who can shop at Fare For ALL? YOU! The misconception is that there is a low income requirement. WRONG! Everyone can shop at Fare For All.
- Forms of payment that are accepted: Cash, credit card, debit card and EBT (checks are not accepted).

Greetings from your Interim Director of SPARK Ministry!

During the months of January - June, Pastor Reggie and many volunteers oversaw the SPARK program, maintained the Kiddos' Corner, and promoted the Worship Whiteboard. A big thanks to Katie Schrack who maintained the Sign-Up Genius for all of the Children's Ministry volunteers during this time. We are so grateful that Krista Hammann was willing to write the SPARK lessons.

My position at Crown of Glory began in July, and it's been wonderful to be part of the staff. Throughout the summer, the Worship Whiteboard continued to be available to kids of all ages. The Whiteboard has jobs that kids can help with during worship. Many kids are participating, helping with offering and communion are popular jobs.

Rally weekend was fun, with many families attending the Block party on Saturday night. Hooperina was a highlight of the event. We did a Blessing of the Backpacks at both the Saturday and Sunday service, we gave away just under 50 backpack tags. SPARK Sunday School continued until the week of November 24 where we switched our focus to the Children's Narrative. The kids learned songs and parts to, "Twas the Evening of Christmas". Ashley Pederson wrote a script, adapted from a book of the same title, by Glenys Nellist. Nineteen SPARK kids participated, with three Connect kids stepping in to help. Ashley Pederson and Sara Keim helped with costumes. Amy von Barnes helped with organization and rehearsals. Kate continued to work with the kids on the music.
